

Your Childs' Progress

At the beginning of the year, within the first two weeks, we hold a parent and child meeting for each class. At this meeting the class teacher sets out exactly what you are to expect within the year your child is in their class. This is also an opportunity for you to ask questions and build a relationship with your child's class teacher.

During October and March we invite parents to have a one to one meeting with their child's teacher. During these meetings, the teacher will be able to explain how well your child has settled into the academy and what their behaviour is like. At this point the class teacher will also share information regarding your child's progress. You will be informed about your child's attendance and the class teacher will also share ideas of how you can support your child at home and what your child needs to focus upon in order to progress through the remainder of the year. These meeting are also an opportunity for you to ask any questions you may have and to look at the books in depth.

In July, you will receive a full report that summarises the achievements that your child has made and the skills that they have acquired during the academic year. The report will also include what your child needs to concentrate upon in order to make further progress.



Also each half term we will share the targets that your child is to work on in reading, writing and maths and have informal drop in afternoons where you can come into the academy and look at your child's books and informally talk to your child's class teacher.

Please remember our staff are always accessible at the end of the school day. If there is anything that you are unsure of then please make an appointment to see your child's class teacher. We aim to work with parents as a team - that is what benefits the children most.
